



# The Nevada Registry: Timeline for Mandatory Participation

As per State Child Care Licensing regulations R112-06 and R001-09, participation in *The Nevada Registry* is now a requirement for all caregivers working in licensed child care settings. This requirement will be phased-in over the next 3-1/2 years. Please see the phase-in guidelines below.

Caregiver Type	Definition	Deadline to Apply	Timeframe
New Caregivers	Any person new to the field.	Within 90 days of employment	Beginning April 1, 2010
New Directors	Any person new to the field applying for Director Approval; already in the field as of April 23, 2009 applying for Director Approval and/or a Director in field as of April 23, 2009 reapplying for Director Approval. <i>(Registry participation is required any time an application for Director Approval is submitted.)</i>	Prior to Director Approval	Beginning April 1, 2010 (Director Approval will <u>not</u> be granted without Registry participation.)
Existing Directors	Directors in the field as of the effective date of R001-09 (TBD) who remain at existing facility for 2 years or more following effective date of regulation.	2 years from the effective date of R001-09 (TBD)	2 years to apply
Family Day Care (FDC) Providers	In-home provider, licensed for up to 6 children and in operation as of April 23, 2009. <i>*Any person applying to become a FDC Provider <u>after</u> April 1, 2010 is considered a new caregiver and must apply to the Registry prior to license being issued.</i>	By December 31, 2011	2-1/2 years to apply
Group Home Providers	In-home provider, licensed for up to 12 children and in operation as of April 23, 2009. <i>*Any person hired to work in the group home <u>after</u> April 1, 2010 is considered a new caregiver and must apply to the Registry within 90 days of employment.</i>	By December 31, 2011	2-1/2 years to apply
Existing Center-Based Caregivers	All caregivers working in a child care center as of April 23, 2009. <i>*Any person leaving current facility/moving to a new facility after April 1, 2010 is considered a new caregiver and must apply to the Registry within 90 days of employment at the new facility.</i>	By December 31, 2012	3-1/2 years to apply

*Note: Maintaining an active status with the Registry is inherent in the mandatory requirement. In addition to initially applying for Career Ladder placement, all caregivers working in licensed child care settings (excluding institutions) must annually renew their Career Development file before their certificate expiration date in order to remain in compliance with child care regulations.*

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
